

Randall Bruce Kelly (R.B.) entered eternal rest with our Father in Heaven on Sunday, May 5th, 2024. He was a one of a kind treasure to his family and friends and will be deeply missed. Born on November 8th, 1943 in Baltimore, Maryland to William Bruce Kelly and Mildred Kelly (Hicks), Randy was raised in Marietta, Georgia where his Dad had moved the family for work at Lockheed. He enjoyed Boy Scouts, church activities at Roswell Street Baptist Church, and trips to the Carolinas to visit his great grandparents and many aunts and uncles and cousins. He loved to go to dances as well as a teenager and said he could sure "cut a rug". He graduated from Marietta High School and went on to attend Georgia Tech in Atlanta for a short time and also Southern Tech in Marietta. He went to work for Lockheed in the drafting department as his first adult job, but yearned for something different. He eventually interviewed with his local county police department and was hired as a patrolman. He spent the next 32 years in various positions of service with the Cobb County Police Department: motorcycle unit, undercover narcotics, homicide, theft and burglary. He dearly loved the work of law enforcement, serving his community, and the brotherhood he developed with fellow cops.

Randy started a family young in life with his wife Ginger Kelly (Owenby). He is survived by their children: Mark Kelly (Tammy) of Powder Springs, GA; Dawn Kelly Cummings (Jim) of Kennesaw, GA; and Page Lively (Paul) of Fairmount, GA. We are beyond grateful for the love she showed to him and our family during the more difficult times we experienced helping Dad battle cancer. Randy's favorite activity of late (with Linda or Dawn driving) was to take a scenic drive up through the North Georgia Mountains, Tennessee, North Carolina, or even just driving around Cobb County to see what all has changed in his old precinct. We'll miss his awesome humor and love of nature. When he was very sick toward the end, he wanted to be rolled out onto the porch to see his wooded lot and enjoy the spring weather. He said it made him feel like he was camping. He was truly a boy scout until the very end.
