

Introduction of Nancy Ingram Jordan
Cobb County Retirees Meeting

Nancy Ingram Jordan, a native of Marietta, Cobb County, Georgia, attended Marietta High School, where she was a three-letter athlete. She later graduated from Emory University and Emory University School of Law, continuing her lifelong enthusiasm for sports through intramural competition in both college and law school.

Nancy practiced law for more than 40 years before retiring two years ago. She began her legal career in Cobb County, serving first as a law clerk to the late Chief Cobb County Superior Court Judge Watson White and later as an Assistant District Attorney under then-Cobb County District Attorney Tom Charron.

In 1999, Nancy entered private practice, where she specialized in appellate litigation involving criminal, business, school board, and family law until her retirement.

Nancy's commitment to fitness began at age 22, when she started teaching fitness classes at studios throughout the Atlanta metro area, including Arden Zinn Studios, Australian Body Works, LA Fitness, World Gym, Health Place, and, most recently, Marietta 24/7 Workout Anytime.
